Autonomous underwater vehicles (AUVs), operated and controlled by AI methods, inspect, maintain, and repair offshore installations underwater. A consortium led by the DFKI developed a holistic solution to make this vision a reality: an innovative, two-armed AUV for complex inspection and maintenance tasks, embedded in a powerful IT infrastructure that enables both intuitive control and monitoring of the system and effective information flow with the plant operator. Horizon Europe Training Resources

Bremer Studienpreis

We would like to draw your attention to the announcement of the Bremen Study Award ("Bremer Studienpreis") for 2022. The prize is endowed with 500 EUR (MA-thesis) and 1,000 EUR (dissertation). Theses must be submitted by June 1, 2022. For further information please refer to the website of the [Bremer Studienpreis](#).

Funding Opportunities (Selected Calls)

DFG

- The **DFG** and **DST** have announced a new funding opportunity for [Indo-German International Research Training Groups](#). The Indo-German consortium will firstly need to submit a joint IRTG draft proposal simultaneously to DFG and DST. The first deadline for draft proposal submission is 1 August 2022. Thereafter, there will be two deadlines each year: 1 February and 1 August.
- In a supplement to the 3rd call for national data infrastructures (NFDIs), the **DFG** now invites applications for [Basic Service Initiatives](#) ("Basisdienst-Initiativen"). The needs of the technical and methodological consortia for basic services can be very diverse and concern services that can potentially be used in all consortia. Binding pre-registrations should be submitted by March 21, 2022 at the latest.

BMBF

- The **BMBF** has announced guidelines for funding projects on the topic of the **demonstration and transfer network AI in production** (ProKI-Netz) in the funding program: "Zukunft der Wertschöpfung – Forschung zu Produktion, Dienstleistung und Arbeit". Universities are to be supported in the establishment and operation of an AI demonstration center and encouraged to participate in a transfer network AI in production (ProKI network). Deadline for stage-I proposals: February 28, 2022.
- A new call for for the promotion of the **medical informatics initiative** has been announced. The funding initiative aims to create the conditions for a long-term and overarching basic structure for data exchange between all university hospitals. Deadline for stage-I proposals: March 31, 2022.

Horizon Europe

- Open Call on **eXtended Reality Technologies** (RIA). Expected Outcome: Innovative eXtended Reality industrial and societal applications, integrating technologies such as advanced visualisation, 3D, Augmented and Virtual Reality experiences, human-machine interaction and cooperation, with a focus on well designed and fully tested scenarios in real-world environment. Deadline: April 05, 2022.
- Forthcoming call on **AI for human empowerment** (AI, Data and Robotics Partnership) (RIA). Proposal results are expected to contribute to at least one of the following expected outcomes: Truly mixed human-AI initiatives for human empowerment // Trustworthy hybrid decision-support systems. Deadline: November 16, 2022.

Science Policy and News

In the Excellence Strategy of the German federal and state governments, the expert panel responsible for shaping the program and defining the funding conditions has agreed on a **timetable for the second competitive round** of the funding program. In addition, the panel, consisting of 39 German and foreign members from the entire spectrum of scientific disciplines, defined initial modalities for the review of outlines and applications for clusters of excellence in the second round of competition.

How should researchers and their work be assessed? This question is often part of funding decisions and appointment procedures – and has made it to the European Commission's checklist of 20 priorities set out in the new **policy agenda of the European Research Area**. France – currently holding the Presidency of the Council of the EU – together with the European Commission and several science and university associations are implementing a "disruptive" plan for research assessment: the **Paris Call on Research Assessment**. While large German Research Associations are still hesitant to sign the agreement and test the new strategy on ground, the European Commission is preparing a change in the evaluation of Horizon Europe proposals. ERC evaluation panels are asked to not consider applicants' impact factors, institutions, or citation indexes, **Science Business** reports.
