

Funding Opportuninites (DFG, BMBF)

- DFG Priority Programme "Theoretical Foundations of Deep Learning" (SPP 2298)

 The present call invites proposals for the second (and last) three-year funding period.

 The research questions to be addressed within this Priority Programme are of a truly interdisciplinary nature and can only be solved by a joint effort of mathematics and computer science. Proposals must be written in English and submitted to the DFG by 1 December 2023 (submission will open on 1 November 2023).
- BMBF: Design Tools for Sovereign Chip Development with Open Source (DE:Sign).

Dr. Lisa-Marie Vortmann nominated for "Deutschen Studienpreis" 2023

Former CSI-Member MMM-member Lisa-Marie Vortmann has been selected for the shortlist of 33 out of 672 young researchers for the German "Studienpreis" 2023. In the final round of the competition the nominees present their research to the jury. In each of the three sections - social sciences, natural and technical sciences, and humanities and cultural studies - one top prize of 25,000 euros and two second prizes of 5,000 euros will be awarded. Other Science News

• Excellence Strategy: 143 Draft Proposals for New Clusters of Excellence submitted. Of the 143 draft proposals, 55 were submitted by several universities in a consortium, including 14 draft proposals submitted jointly by three universities. Our CHORUS-proposal with the universities of Bielefeld and Paderborn is therefore one of only a small number of such proposals with two other universities.

80 percent of the draft proposals envisage the participation of non-university partners.

The majority of the new concepts are interdisciplinary: nearly half the projects (64 draft proposals, or 45 percent) describe themselves as belonging to more than one scientific discipline. 31 percent of the draft proposals see their thematic focus in the life sciences, 28 percent in the humanities and social sciences; 21 percent of the projects are predominantly rooted in the engineering sciences and 20 percent in the natural sciences. • Diversity News Update: According to recent data, International academic staff at German universities in 2021 amounted to around 59,300 academic and artistic staff of foreign nationalities, or 13.9% of all academic staff. Since 2018, the number of international staff has increased by 20%. By comparison, the number of German academics and researchers has only risen by 5% over the same period. Further details:
